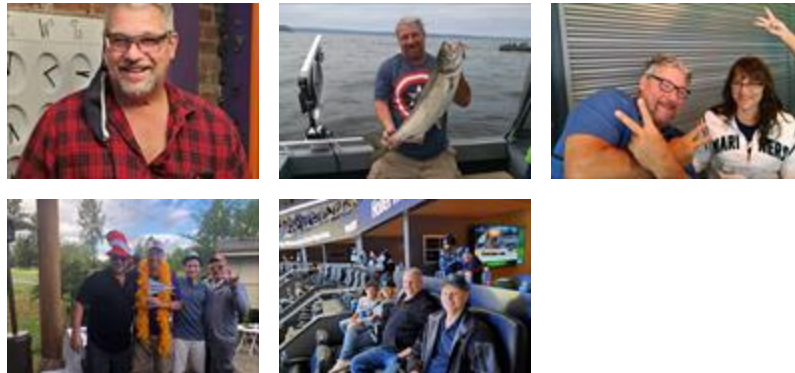
“ Kathy and I send our heartfelt condolences to Ken’s family and friends. Gone too soon and missed so much! We fortunately have so many great memories!
